## 1. Old Business

- A. Review of meeting minutes from May 6, 2022
  - a. Approved by SAC

## 2. New Business

- A. ASCOCC Budget Line Item Detail Lindsay Buccafurni, Assistant Director of Student Life
  - a. ASCOCC is proposing \$72,000 from student fees. There was a healthy rollover from previous years, and a majority of the rollover is from student program funds. (Student program funds are for club funds. Student government funds supports activities and events for students, and supports other departments with their events). Rollover funds were also due to decreased club activity in the previous years; however, new student clubs have formed. Some clubs fundraise for their clubs, such as Culinary and LGBTQ.
  - b. ASCOCC increased the wage to \$14.00 (similar to that of computer lab student employees).
  - ASCOCC deceased funding for Bobcat Orientation (agreed by Buffy Stoll Turton, Director of First-Year Experience).
  - d. The funds will subsidize Cascades East Transit (CET) fees.
  - e. For internal funding, ASCOCC decided to not be a part of the Oregon Student Association (OSA). OSA annual membership cost was \$28,000. OSA represents student councils across Oregon and supports with legislation and professional development. ASCOCC did not feel that the work done by OSA was benefitting community colleges or ASCOCC. COCC was one of two community colleges in the OSA.
  - f. Historically, Student Affairs Committee serves as a check and balance for the ASCOCC budget and acts as a neutral voice to provide an equitable approach for spending towards student clubs.
  - g. Motioned to approve by Thor, seconded by Nicole.
- B. Results from 2021 Survey of Entering Student Engagement (SENSE) Alicia Moore
  - a. Originating from University of Texas Austin, SENSE is sent to first-year students to look at their experiences in and out of the classroom. We alternate years between the SENSE and the College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE).
