This Faculty in BPHS have reviewed the syllabi of the above COCC courses and determined that they are sufficiently equivalent to the OSU courses in content,

- Generally, no course can be used to meet more than one requirement
- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation. 60 must be upper division (300 and 400 numbered courses)
- A maximum of 124 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward an OSU baccalaureate degree.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 are accepted at OSU. A total of 12 credit hours of professional technical courses are transferable as general elective, pass credits.
- Departments, programs, schools, or colleges at OSU may restrict the courses used by their major students to satisfy each general educational component.
- OSU will accept D grades. However, EXSS adheres to a Minimum Grade Policy of C- for any course used in the major (Exercise Science Core, Required Supporting Courses, and EXSS Courses Beyond the Core above).
- This articulation guide is subject to change without notice. Students should visit with an OSU advisor if they have any questions
- Application for admission to OSU is on a rolling basis with the deadline one month prior to the start of the term.
- GPA for EXSS retention: 1) minimum of a 2.25 GPA in EXSS option courses, and 2) minimum of 2.50 GPA in all EXSS-prefixed courses GPA for graduation: 1) Cumulative GPA at OSU must be 2.00; 2) last 45 credits at OSU must be 2.00; and 3) two of the last three terms must be 2.00.
- Out of the last 75 credits, 45 must be taken at OSU or petition to accept transfer.
- Courses which are listed in this agreement as specific requirements cannot be taken S/U
